A CEM church plant gives birth to INHiM

In 2004, Christian Evangelistic Mission (CEM) took a risk by trying something new to reach a rapidly growing group of people. When we follow God, He often leads us out of the familiar into the unknown.

A dramatically growing number of people in Iowa need to hear the gospel in Spanish (table), their primary and heart language. God led us to Mario Lara, whom we partnered with to start Lifebridge Christian Church (Iglesia de Cristo de Puente de Vida) in Des Moines, Iowa.

I am very proud of CEM and Mario for starting this venture so that Hispanic people can have a life bridge back to God.

CEM's role with the church plant Lifebridge Christian Church is gradually transitioning from direct financial support of one church to a ringing endorsement of the newly established INHiM, a ministry developed to serve Hispanics in a much broader geographic area. We hope CEM churches will now consider giving aid to INHiM directly.

CEM is glad to have supported the church plant because through it, God is changing lives in the Spanish-speaking culture in the Des Moines area. With the creation of INHiM, we look forward to even greater results over an almost unlimited geographic area.

Working INHiM from Iowa to Nebraska to the ends of the Earth

The INHiM leadership team is made up of people who understand and can reach our target audience, and is chaired by Mario Lara.

Mario, through the church plant Lifebridge Christian Church, has reached first and second generation professionals and educators and who are committed to help reach other Spanish-speaking people for Christ. Mario has also formed relationships with English-speaking individuals from established churches who share the vision.

Another exciting aspect is Mario's ministry role through this transition. A leader and minister, Mario is shifting from ministering traditionally through one congregation to training ministry leaders at Lifebridge Christian Church and in many geographical locations in the following ways:

- Mario has recorded many sermons and lessons in Spanish for use by small group leaders in locations starting in lowa and Nebraska. There have already been instances of these lessons and sermons being viewed from outside the U.S.
- Mario provides weekly training to leaders, who then regularly lead small groups in their communities, currently including Ankeny, Des Moines, Marshalltown, and Scotts Bluff/Gering in Nebraska.

Praise God! Our brotherhood now has a more effective way to reach the growing Spanish-speaking population.

Mario would be happy to act as a resource to any established church who realizes a need within their community.

Whether a Hispanic couple has moved in next door or the mission team is looking for a way to reach out locally or within lowa, a phone call can provide assistance of many types: brochures in Spanish, information on CIBC Hispanic family camp, discussions of starting a Hispanic small group within the established church.

Currently, INHiM is purchasing video equipment to record Mario's sermons and lessons in Spanish for use by small group leaders and others who speak Spanish. This is roughly a \$3500 equipment list, and over half of that amount has already been raised for this investment.

Faith, Family, and Fellowship at Latino Family Christian Camp

Lifebridge Christian Church sponsors two non-denominational Latino family camps each year. These camps provide time for families to relax, recharge and re-focus.

Directed by Mario Lara, the camps are usually held over the Memorial Day and Labor Day weekends. Adult programming and worship are in Spanish. Children and youth programming is bi-lingual. Lessons center on Biblical wisdom, teachings of Jesus, Godly living, and worship. The camps also provide an opportunity to fellowship with other Spanish speakers.

The next Latino Family Christian Camp will be August 29-31, 2014 at the Central Iowa Bible Camp 18578 335th Lane Earlham, Iowa. Registration and dinner start at 6 p.m. Aug 29. Camp will end 9:30 p.m. August 31.

Friday activities include registration, dinner, and worship. Saturday events include worship, classes, Christian Dynamics (for all age groups), sports (basketball, volleyball, and soccer), plus a movie and bonfire. Sunday devotions will be offered, as well as Sunday school, and church services will be held.

Cost for registration is \$29 for individual, \$70 per family and pre-registration is required. If you register after August 24, cost is \$90 for family and \$40 per individual. Family style cabins are available, families can bring tents if they would like. Meals are included in registration fee.
